Bertin A Weyl III has over 45 years in the television and motion picture industry, largely in a variety of engineering positions. Most recently, he held the position of Senior Studio Engineer for six years at Westlake Village Studios supporting Universal (NBC) Sports, retiring in late 2017. He was responsible for providing technical support for daily live shows, via satellite and network feeds over fiber. Maintaining 6 edit rooms, 2 audio rooms, two studio control rooms and a 6500 square foot stage. Frequently, having to make decisions, create solutions and “thinking on the fly” to meet deadlines and airtimes was part of the normal routine.

While Bert was having all that fun, his wife, Alexandra, retired from thirty-three years as an educator, teaching primarily 6th grade. In the late 1990's she found the Stagecoach Inn Museum and began a career volunteering and Docenting at the Inn. Becoming active in the Docent Council and, eventually Docent Chair in 2004. Alexandra became a member of the Board of Trustees in 2016.

Eventually Alex managed to get Bert involved at the Inn and, as time permitted, he became a volunteer. Working closely with the director, Sandy Hildebrandt, the staff and coordinators, Bert was able to repair and improve various areas around the museum, contributing to improving the AV and IT capabilities on the property. Over time, Mr. Weyl realized he could offer his talents and experiences in “thinking on the fly” to help solve problems for the museum and Conejo Valley Historical Society. Eventually becoming a Docent, Mr. Weyl enjoys leading guests around the 4.5-acre property.

Mr. Weyl has served on the Board of Trustees and Executive Board of the Conejo Valley Historical Society since 2015. He served as President of the Society in 2018 and 2019. He continues to serve the CVHS in various capacities today.

Mr. Weyl received a BA from Pasadena City College in Radio, Television and Communication. He is a Lifetime Member of the Society of Motion Picture and Television Engineers (SMPTE), Past President of the Society of Television Engineers (two terms), Member of the Audio Engineering Society.
